7. Schedule Type Changes—Elizabeth Barton (See Excel attachment)

Faculty workload project adds more meaning to Banner fields for workload attached to Schedule Type for all courses. The current workload rules were examined to compare to the Schedule type glossary (mtg. handout) to determine how to calculate workload (e.g. combined schedule types vs. two separate).

Conclusions were to separate combined types into two, and make all 599-Thesis, all 699-Dissertation, and Independent Study-Sr. Thesis. Also, all courses without the aforementioned classifications will have Recitation added to the schedule type.

A blanket approval took care of all. FSCC approved.

8. New Business.

There will be two April FSCC meetings (4/1 and 4/15) due to large volume of forms needing approval.

Comments from Wynn Goering.

Programs and degrees are being evaluated to perhaps be eliminated, as UNM can only theoretically support a finite number of programs. Because of the current molecular approval process of new programs, the University may become unsustainable. A broader context in governance to collaborate in managing new proposals may help lessen any conflict between departments and approval committees. Generally, a whole picture/broader scope of department offerings could be an improvement over reviewing only pieces at a time.
