Form C: Minor Revisions to Certificate in Pre-Professional Elementary Education at UNM-Los Alamos

Our overall goal is to modify our Certificate to reflect the changes that we made to the AA in Pre-Professional Elementary Education. (The Form C for our AA degree is being submitted at the same time as this Form C to update our Certificate.) These changes are inspired by an increased demand for this degree from students, as well as a need for students to have more course options so they may transfer to a variety of 4-year institutions. Both our AA and Certificate have been expanded to allow more options for these students in almost all areas of the degree. Also, we have added a Computer Technology course to help prepare current teachers to work in a technology-supported classroom.

- 1. Increase the overall credit hours of this Certificate from 31 to 32. This reflects the reduction of hours under History from 6 to 3, and the addition of a Computer Technology course for 4 credit hours. The net change is an increase of 1 credit hour.
- 2. Under Writing and Speaking, allow students to select from either CJ220 or CS130, instead of strictly CS220.
- 3. Under Fine Arts: allow students to select from a selection of 10 classes instead of only 3.
- **4.** Under History: reduce the number of credit hours from 6 to 3. This will allow us to require a computer technology course in the degree (see item 8 below). Students may then select only 1 course from the list instead of 2 courses.
- **5.** Under Physical and Natural Science: Allow students to select from a list of 4 courses instead of only 1.
- **6.** Under Mathematics: allow students to select from 2 courses instead of only 1.
- 7. Under Behavioral and Social Sciences: no change.
- **8.** Under Foreign Language: no change.
- **9.** Add a Computer Technology requirement of 4 credit hours.
- **10.** Under Education Requirements: allow students only 1 choice since the other Education course at this level was removed from the main campus catalog.
