## Community Health (CH) Concentration in Public Health

### Impact

The proposed change is to delete courses currently not offered for catalog year 2016-2017 replacing with courses that will be offered, tailoring the CH Concentration. The additional options provide some additional flexibility for the students to select elective courses.

The changes would not require any additional resources from the UNM Libraries or IT since students completing the concentration are already enrolled in our graduate program.

There will be no changes in faculty workload since the MPH faculty are currently teaching the courses.
