### 5. Faculty Senate President's Report

Faculty Senate President Finnie Coleman reported the following:

- The University Secretary search should be completed soon. There are four finalists for the position.
- President Coleman has had meetings with the Faculty Senate Presidents of the Mountain West Conference. Continuity of instruction plans was discussed. Boise State is modeling what CNM is doing. UNM will host a governance leaders conference once the COVID pandemic is over.
- There is no new update on OMA and IPRA. There is still not a definitive answer. The concern is Open Meetings Act and its applicability. All FS committees may need to comply. The UNM Senate will comply and operate under OMA, even if it appears it would not apply. Agendas will post 72 hours prior to the meeting and will have public access to meetings. Senate meetings will be online through the fall semester and possibly into the spring semester.
- There are branch campus ad hoc committees being created.
  - Review the Regent's manual, Big Red, the Faculty Handbook (FHB), etc., to identify where there is overlap and places that will need more alignment.
  - Connecting with senators and colleagues at the Branch campuses. There is a lot that needs to be done; there are issues such as teaching load and also connectivity. President Coleman will be meeting with the faculty of UNM Gallup to discuss tenure and promotion. There will be a branch campus leaders meeting scheduled soon and will be reoccurring.

• Faculty are asked to encourage their students to fill out the census. New Mexico is very behind where it should be. Data is confidential. There is no citizenship question. The deadline was moved up from October 31 to September 30. There is a postcard included with the agenda.

Interventional Response Task Force (IRTF) meets daily at 8:30 AM

Targeted Interventional Testing:

- Testing site is live in Lot C
- By appointment only for students directed after triage by SHAC (symptomatic students and potential exposures) and analysis by IRTF
- Samples sent to TriCore for analysis expected capacity is ~50 per day plus surge capacity
- SHAC procuring point-of-care testing system
- Note: testing is nationally rationed

A limited number of study / work spaces are open and announced to students via email



# Budget

Academic Affairs reduced I&G revenues by \$22M relative to FY20 (net of compensation) • \$6.8M pre-covid, and \$15.2M post-covid

Reduction of \$15M relative to original FY21 budget (net of compensation): 7.14%

Reduction to schools and colleges: 7.08% of I&G revenues

- Factors used to distribute reductions of I&G allocations for FY21:
- 1. Previously budgeted I&G allocations
- 2. SCH trends over 5 years
- 3. External funding (gifts, grants, RPSP, etc.)

Reduction to central academic units: 7.34%

 Reductions based on tiers (Significant reduction, U Secretary, Grad & LAII, Essential Services, Optional academic activities and museums)

Waiting on next legislative session - 5% cut expected

Planning to launch a main campus budget site this fall

### 9. Discussion of Faculty Handbook Policies

C07 Faculty Disciplinary Policy D175 Student Conduct and Grievance Procedures D176 Graduate Student Grievance Procedures

#### 10. Discussion of Title IX

Faculty Senate Ethics and Advisory Committee Chair Stephen Bishop reported:

- The Federal Government changed Title IX with a compliance deadline of August 15, 2020.
- OEO was given basically one hundred days' notice, but there are a lot of changes. Hearing procedures have changed as well. Students will need more support going forward
- Faculty S.A.F.E. (Sexual Assault Free Environment). There is a web page for it. Please search UNM SAFE.

Title IX coordinator Angela Catena added:

The Department of Education published its changes on May 6, 2020, giving institutions receiving federal funds 100 days to comply. These are historical changes, there has been nothing this major since its conception.

- DOE significantly limited what institutions can do to hold someone responsible for sexual assault.
- Their definition of sexual harassment has changed. It is now at odds with a civil rights law. New statement is 'Unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature that is so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive.' Change being making it 'and objectively offensive' rather than 'or objectively offensive'.
- Policies D175 and D176 had to be changed to be in compliance with Title IX.
- OEO used to operate on a single investigator model under which it will no longer operate. A hearing officer and a hearing coordinator will be hired.
- All investigations will go to hearing with cross examination. Reporting will likely go down. Formal complaints will have to be filed.
- Support will need to be increased to aid students that do not want to go through the hearing process.
