We are reducing the total number of credits of our degree program to 120 credits. These changes are at the behest of the Administration's efforts to increase four year graduation rates. The Art Education area must also meet the education requirements for licensure as stated below in New Mexico Senate Bill 329 signed in to law in April 8, 2015 to become effective on July 1, 2016 (http://www.sos.state.nm.us/uploads/files/SB329-CH97-2015.pdf). A. "The department shall require a person seeking licensure or reciprocity in elementary, special, early childhood or secondary education to have completed the following minimum requirements in the college of arts and sciences: (1) nine semester hours in communication; (2) six semester hours in mathematics; (3) eight semester hours in laboratory science; (4) nine semester hours in social and behavioral sciences; and (5) nine semester hours in humanities and fine arts." Changes include: (1) EDPY 303 Human Growth and Development. This class has been moved from the Professional Education and Art Education courses to the Social and Behavioral Sciences because 3 additional credits were required in the Social and Behavioral Sciences (2) To replace ARTE 430 with ARTE 431-437 Many sections of ARTE 430 were offered as a Topics classes for many years until the faculty submitted a form for each section giving each class its own course number. The catalog was never revised to reflect that change. (3) Update ARTS121 and ARTS122 with ARTS125 and ARTS126. The Art & Art History Department replaced ARTS121/122 with ARTS125/126. (4) All ARTE courses required for the major must be passed with a grade of B- or better. The faculty feel this is the minimum performance standard for students in the major.
