




## Desired Operational Outcomes



- Maximize efficient use of Regent effort by removing Regents from the subordinate boards, eliminating the HSC Committee, and focusing Regent oversight through a single governance mechanism – the HSC Board of Directors
- for the HSC and UNM Health System Student Affairs and HSC Committees into a single Regent-appointed Board HSC Board that combines the roles of the Regents F&F, Academic and
- Waximize delegated authority from the Regents to the HSC Board -
- WHITH Board of Trustees to have "governing body" status
- UNM Medical Group, Inc., and UNM Sandoval Regional Medical Center, Inc. Boards of Directors to manage affairs of those corporations
- HSC Board to set strategic parameters and goals for the "UNM Health System"
- coordinating with the President HSC as a distinct organization within UNM headed by a Chancellor /
