Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 3:01 p.m. Faculty Senate President Cris Elder presided. Attendance was recorded on the attendance sheet which can be found in the supporting documents.

1. Approval of the Agenda

President Elder requested a motion to accept the agenda, and the agenda was approved as presented.

2. Approval of March 25, 2025, Meeting Minutes

The March 25 minutes were approved as presented.

3. President's Report

President Garnett Stokes reported on the following:

- The federal government terminated visas for some of our international students and then last Friday this action was reversed. Nationally, some lawsuits were filed regarding this action and leadership will continue to monitor this with concerns about the impact on recruitment and retention of international students.
- The federal government has also issued actions regarding indirect research cost reimbursement rates related to the Department of Energy. This is another directive being challenged.
- UNM is a member of the American Public and Land Grant Universities organization, and she serves as a member of the APU with a number of leaders. PLU and APU are monitoring many of these issues closely for public and land grant research universities. As leadership works to position the institution in the future, they look forward to more conversations and input from students and staff.
- Some University administrative policy changes have been posted. These were revised based on feedback from the UNM community and are policies related to equal opportunity and recruitment.
- The Clinical and Translational Science Center received a \$2,000,000 award from NIH to pilot a program that brings clinical research into rural and underserved communities across the state.

- UNM is leading a collaborative to address challenges facing Western states like wildfires and water scarcity and rapid urban growth as part of the Intermountain West Transformation Network.
- The Nurse Midwifery program continues to be ranked very highly in the country.
- The UNM PD headquarters construction has begun, partially funded by an institutional bond.
- Three students have been named for the prestigious Goldwater Scholars- Mia Baca, Victoria Nisoli, and Ariana Pritha.
- Two faculty members, Melissa Emery Thompson and Joan Bybee, were recognized as American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) Fellows, an incredibly high honor for faculty.
- Nine physicians were named in the 2025 list of Top Docs.
- The President recognized at a celebration faculty and staff donors who contributed financially during the last year to the University, with more than 1,000 people giving nearly \$4 million as part of UNM's Big Give campaign.

President Stokes took questions from faculty.

4. Provost's Report

- There are about 40 stop work orders on grants at this point and a number of others that have been rescinded. The Department of Energy announced moving to a 15% indirect cost rate and has given the University 30 days to comply. There is an appeals process for grants that are stopped, and the University is evaluating various grants to determine if appeals will be filed. It is a "heavy lift" and they are engaging outside counsel for help. There is a focus on pursuing appeals that are more likely to be successful.
- The Rainforest Innovation Awards recognized faculty at the institution who have received patents, trademarks, and copyrights over the last year and two faculty who received the Rainforest Innovation Fellow Award, Laura Hudson, and National Academy of Inventor Fellow, Angela Wandinger-Ness.

The Provost took questions from faculty.

5. Faculty Senate President's Report

- President Cris Elder made senators aware of and discussed the UNM Sanctuary Campus Working Group resolution that was presented to Faculty Senate over eight years ago, passed and adopted February 2017. The context of the resolution is remarkably similar to our current context.
- Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HAKU) is offering a webinar on May 1 on the status of Dreamers and DACA recipients.
- A 4% increase in compensation was approved at the last Board of Regents. There will be a 9% increase in employee contributions to health benefits. UA UN faculty union is still negotiating the new collective bargaining agreement.
- Faculty Senate Operations Committee is working with Provost Holloway about the current guidelines for remote work to improve the guidelines.

- Faculty Senate is currently accepting nominations for the Operations Committee and President-Elect. Senators are highly encouraged to nominate themselves and others.
- President Elder announced that this was her last Faculty Senate meeting as president and thanked the OUS staff and the Operations Committee members, and welcomed Roberta as the incoming president, beginning her service July 1.

7. “A Framework for Teaching and Learning Success at UNM” Endorsement

Dr. Lippitt and Dr. Spong presented updates to the framework and requested an endorsement by the Faculty Senate.

The endorsement was approved as presented.

8. Posthumous Degree Request

President Elder presented on behalf of Lisa Lindquist, Dean of Students Program Manager, for a posthumous degree awarded to student Anthony Kanowitz. It was noted that Mr. Kanowitz passed with three credits short of the requirement for a posthumous degree, but both the college and Graduate Committee gave approval to award the degree.

The posthumous degree was approved as presented.

9. New Bachelor of Arts in Sustainability and Environmental Studies

Department Associate Chair of Geography and Environmental Sciences presented on the new proposed program and the new program was approved as presented.

11. Public Comment

There were no public comments.

12. Faculty Senate Breakout Groups

Due to time constraints, the faculty senate breakout groups were suspended.
