Reason(s) for Request  * (enter text below or upload a doc/pdf file)  The purpose of this Form C is to request changes related to the merger of two Graduate concentrations in Anthropology, Human Evolutionary Ecology (HEE) and Biological Anthropology (B) into a single concentration, Evolutionary Anthropology (EVA). The changes below are to delete the currently listed requirements for the Master's and Ph.D. degrees that are listed separately for HEE and B and replace them with a single description of the requirements for each degree for EVA. In the process of merging, two of the current "Emphases" within Biological Anthropology ("Forensic Anthropology," and "Bioarchaeology," described on p. 147 of the current Catalog) have been dropped. Two of the faculty who were the primary forces behind these emphases have left UNM. The new text for EVA is tailored to allow students to pursue a wider variety of specialized avenues of training, which each student will construct in consultation with her or his advisor. The total number of required, core classes that a student must complete prior to taking the Comprehensive Exam to obtain a Master's degree is similar in the new EVA guidelines as in the old HEE and B guidelines, but more options and flexibility are built into the requirements.
