This request is to re-word the current catalog description of the "Required Supportive Courses for the B.A.". No actual change in required courses is requested; instead, the new wording is intended to replicate the requirements as they have been advertised on the Biology website for the last several years, and eliminate any ambiguity that the current phrasing of these requirements may present in the catalog. The problem that needs correcting arose as follows: for many years, students have been required to take 7 semesters of math, physics, and chem courses for their BA in Biology. To allow some flexibility, students have been given a choice of courses to satisfy this requirement. One of the choices was to take PHYC 102 "and one of the following", which originally referred to a group of additional physics-related choices, including EPS 101; unfortunately, however, when other course choices within that group were eliminated by their departments leaving only EPS 101, the phrase "and one of the following" was incorrectly left in the catalog, so that now students might interpret the catalog to mean that other required courses (i.e. in Chemistry) could be used along with PHYC 102 to satisfy the situation.
