The College of Pharmacy is constantly evaluating our Doctor of Pharmacy curriculum for improvement. As part of this evaluation, our clinical volunteer faculty (preceptors) are regularly surveyed. Through this process we have discovered that students do not have the knowledge necessary in the area of over-the-counter (OTC) drug products when they perform their Community Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPE) in their first year. In order to address this deficiency, the College has voted for a minor change in the curriculum in which our current 3-credit OTC course (PHRM 719-currently taught in the fall of the second year) is being split into a 2 credit PHRM 719 course to be taught in the spring semester of the first PharmD year and a new 1-credit course (PHRM 721) to be taught in the fall of the second PharmD year. In addition, the IPPE credits that the students enroll for in the spring of the first year will be moved to the fall of the second year. There is no net change to the number of credits that students need for completion of the Pharm.D. degree nor any changes in the number of credits students register for in any one semester. This new delivery of OTC drug content and performance of IPPE will greatly improve our students preparation for community pharmacy practice.

Statements to address budgetary and Faculty Load Implications and Long-range planning * (enter text below or upload a doc/pdf file)

There is no faculty or budget implications with the splitting of the current PHRM 719 Self-care Therapeutics (3 credits in fall semester) to a 2-credit PHRM 719 to be taught in the spring and a 1-credit PHRM 721 Self-care Therapeutics II course to be taught in the fall. The IOR s teaching load will remain the same only spread over two semesters. There are also no faculty or budget implications with the changes in Community IPPE (PHRM 771). The changes are credit hour neutral and the students who take these courses are supervised by volunteer preceptor faculty. There is no change for current tenure track or clinical educator track faculty.
