The overarching aim of revisions to this concentration are to streamline the program of study for ease of degree matriculation and advising. Revisions include:
1. Replacing sunsetted courses and the addition of five new courses.
2. Removing Dissertation Seminar as a required course given that sections have not been offered in several years.
3. Revising and reorganizing electives and outside area credit requirements to allow for greater flexibility in designing coursework to meet student needs and interest.
4. Revising core courses to bring the PhD program in alignment with revisions to the MS program that occurred in 2019.
