Catalog Information

Program Description

The Anderson school of Managements "4-1" program allows students completing an undergraduate degree at UNM to begin their MSPM studies early. It is recommended that students complete Business Calculus and undergraduate statistics before applying. For the first three years of university studies, the student pursues a normal program of undergraduate work. During the junior year of academic work, the student applies for admission to the MSPM program of the Anderson Graduate School. In the senior year of academic work, the student begins the first year of the MSPM program and also completes the requirements for a bachelor's degree in the undergraduate field. In the final year of study, the student completes the remaining requirements for the MSPM program.

Admissions Requirements

The minimum requirements for a complete application to the Anderson MSPM are:

- All official transcripts for all universities and colleges attended at time of application. International applicants are to provide official transcript and degree certification/diploma in native language and official English translation.
- Official GMAT or GRE scores unless a waiver has been granted*
- Statement of Intent
- Resume
